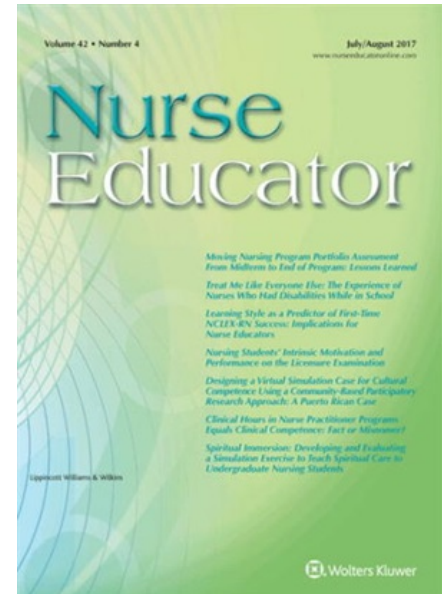

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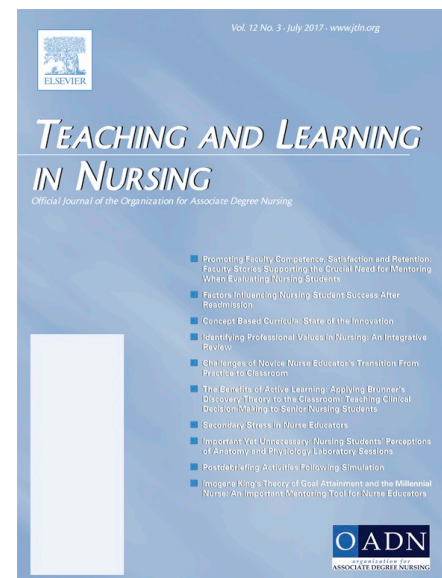

Invitation to participate in a study on The Visibility of QSEN Competencies in Clinical Evaluation Tools in US Pre-licensure Schools of Nursing.

Clinical evaluation tools assess critical components of nursing practice. Schools of nursing in both the US and Sweden are responsible for integrating the six QSEN competencies (patient centered care, teamwork and collaboration, evidence based practice, quality improvement, safety and informatics) into their programs. Evidence indicates the competencies make a difference in clinical outcomes.

Purposes:

1. To replicate a Swedish study to assess visibility of the QSEN competencies in clinical evaluation tools in pre-licensure nursing schools in the US
To complete an audit to determine reliability of self-report for the visibility of the QSEN competencies in clinical nursing evaluation tools
